<p>Dr. John Richardson is a Professor in the Department of Forest and Conservation Sciences at the University of British Columbia, where he is also director of the Stream and Riparian Research Laboratory. His research addresses questions of ecology and management of streams, riparian areas and with a broad interest in aquatic biology, and particularly stream-riparian interactions. He has published over 200 scientific articles, more than 150 of them in international, peer-reviewed journals. Over 40 graduate students, 15 post-doctoral fellows and 10 research assistants, as well as dozens of undergraduate honours students, have studied in his research team. He was previously on the editorial boards of the <i>Canadian Journal of Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences</i>, the <i>Journal of Applied Ecology</i>, and <i>Journal of the North American Benthological Society</i>. Richardson recently completed a 5-year term as Head of School. He is and has been a member of several endangered species recovery teams.
