

OVERVIEW

The Coordination and Support Action <u>IC4WATER</u> was launched in January 2017 in support of the Water JPI, and is funded by the European Commission under H2020. IC4WATER aims to implement Joint Activities in a dedicated effort to reinforce international cooperation in the area of water challenges, and to further support the implementation and the strategy of the Water JPI.

IC4WATER focuses in particular on the UN Sustainable Development Goals (<u>UN SDGs</u>) related to water challenges for implementing the Water JPI Strategic Research & Innovation Agenda (<u>SRIA 2.0</u>). It will be implemented through a Joint Call for transnational collaborative projects on research and innovation to support the implementation of water policies. IC4WATER aims to develop new governance and knowledge management approaches by:

- Developing new approaches and tools for water management aimed at setting up innovative alternatives suitable for decision-making.
- Envisaging education and communication initiatives to raise social awareness of consumption habits and water scarcity and to increase the levels of social acceptance and use of recycled water.

IC4WATER will benefit researchers, policy-makers, water authorities, utility operators, industry and citizens by developing research and innovation in the water area.

Scope of the 2017 Joint Transnational Call funded under IC4WATER

Proposals are invited on the topic "Water resource management in support of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals", organised around two challenges:

- Multiple pressure effects on ecosystems and ecosystem services as well as effective mitigation adaptation tools
 and assessments for implementing the water related targets of the UN SDGs.
- Developing accessible solutions for clean water management to address UN SDG6 targets and associated SDGs.

The Water JPI 2017 Joint Call will be funded by 12 Funding Partner Organisations from 12 countries.

This Call is for collaborative transnational research proposals. Consortia should include a minimum of 3 partners from 3 different participating countries.

Researchers from other countries can also participate at their own costs (commitment needed for being associated to a consortium applying to the Water JPI 2017 Joint Call).

Planned Timeframe

Opening of the 2017 Joint Call - 11 October 2017

Webinar for applicants - 27 November 2017

1st stage – Deadline for submission of pre-proposals: 11 December 2017, 17h00 (CET) 2nd stage – Deadline for submission of full proposals: 27 June 2018, 17h00 (CEST)

The webinar has been postponed to 27 November 2017.

The webinar will start with a 20-25 min presentation on how to apply, including guidance through templates and FAQ. The next 1.5 hours will be open for questions from attendees: Submit written questions through the webinar platform. The call secretariat will reply to all attendees through audio.

Eligibility: Main Criteria



MAIN RULES (I):

- Each consortium must be composed of at least a minimum of <u>three eligible</u> <u>partners</u> that <u>request funding</u> from <u>participating Funding Partner Organisations</u> from <u>three different countries</u>;
- Proposals should be submitted by Universities and other higher education institutions, public research institutions, private non-profit organisations, and private companies, according to National/Regional Regulations;
- A partner in a proposal is defined as i) a principal investigator that requests funds
 or ii) a principal investigator that contributes with own funds to the proposal;
- **all** proposals should emphasise participation of stakeholders, and dissemination and exploitation of results.



Eligibility: Main Criteria



MAIN RULES (II)

- Proposals MUST be received before the deadlines;
- Proposals MUST meet all the formal criteria (submitted electronically, respect page limits and number/type of attachments allowed, written in English language);
- Topics of proposals MUST be fully relevant to the scope of the call;
- Maximum <u>requested</u> global budget per proposal: I.5 M€;
- Duration of projects: MUST be between 24 to 36 months;
- Open Access requirements for all scientific publications produced by the projects funded by the Joint Call.



National/Regional Regulat 2017 JOINT CALL

In addition to the General Eligibility Criteria...

 Each partner should contact their National Contact Point (see Call Announcement, chapter X) to assure the full compliance with the National/Regional Eligibility Criteria, as described in the National/Regional Regulations.

Each partner must ensure that his/her contribution to the overall project conforms to:

- Where applicable, relevance of the topic(s)/subtopic(s) of the proposals to national/regional programmes and strategies;
- Compliance with national funding criteria and regulations;
- Compliance with limits to budget requests, or any other aspects detailed in the documentation available.



How to complete Part B

Part B of the proposal contains the details of the proposed research and collaborative efforts. At the preproposal stage, the practical arrangements planned to implement the proposal (this will relate to the Quality and Efficiency of the Implementation Section of the Full Proposal at second stage) will not be evaluated by the independent experts. We would advise you to address each of the award criteria as outlined in the following sections. Please note that the explanatory notes below serve to explain the evaluation criteria without being exhaustive.



Applicants must structure their proposal according to the headings indicated in the Part B preproposal template below.

Applicants must ensure that their pre-proposals conform to the layout and to the instructions given on this page. The **maximum total length of sections 1 to 3 of Part B of the proposal is 5 pages**. Taken into consideration that the overall document will have <u>one page for the cover</u> and <u>one page for the table of contents</u>, the overall page count must be 7 at maximum.

There is no specific page limit per each individual section of Part B. Within the overall five-page limit, applicants are therefore free to decide on the length dedicated to each section.

Please remember that it is your responsibility to comply with the page limit and all other formal eligibility criteria. Proposals not meeting all these criteria will be declined without further review.



The page size is A4, and all margins (top, bottom, left, right) should be at least 15 mm (not including any footers or headers). This document has the correct format and font. Use this as your starting document and delete where appropriate. Use the same font and style for the whole

proposal (Times New Roman, 11 pt, single spacing).

Literature references should be listed in footnotes, font size 9. However, regardless of the format used, all footnotes will count towards the page limit.

Please make sure that the **Part B of your proposal carries as a header to each page the proposal acronym.** All pages should be numbered in a single series on the footer of the page to prevent errors during handling. The numbering format "**Page X of Y**" should be used.

Please provide a short summary of the proposal, which can be the same as the publishable abstract, built around the research/innovation project.

2. EXCELLENCE

This section is intended to evaluate the quality, innovative aspects and credibility of the research, including inter/multidisciplinary aspects. The following subtopics should be included:

- Introduction
- State-of-the-art
- Objectives and overview of the action (The specific objectives for the project should be clear, measurable, realistic and achievable within the duration of the project. Objectives should be consistent with the expected exploitation and impact of the project)
- Relation to the scope of the call (Clearly inficate wich challenge(s) and sub-topic(s) your proposal is
 addressing and explain how your proposal addresses the specific challenge and scope of that topic, as
 set out in the Call description.)
- Work package description (including research methodology and approach, highlighting the type of research and innovation activities proposed)
- Originality and innovative aspects of the research (explain the contribution that the project is
 expected to make to advancements, including novel concepts, approaches or methods employed)

3. IMPACT (topics to be included are described below):

This section is intended to evaluate the impact of the research project. The following subtopics should be included:

- Expected Outcomes and impact of the research ((i) Describe how your project will contribute to: (a)
 each of the expected impacts mentioned in the Call Announcement, under the relevant topic; (b) any
 substantial impacts not mentioned in the Call Announcement, that would enhance innovation
 capacity; (ii) Describe any barriers/obstacles, and any framework conditions (such as regulation,
 standards, public acceptance, workforce considerations, financing of follow-up steps, cooperation of
 other links in the value chain, that may determine whether and to what extent the expected impacts
 will be achieved.)
- Exploitation (All applicants should ensure that the results of their project are disseminated and
 exploited, e.g. communicated, transferred into other research/innovation settings or, if appropriate,
 commercialised).
- Added-value of the partnership to Water RDI
