FUTURE GLOBAL WATER CRISIS

Anders Berntell, Executive Director of the Stockholm International Water Institute (SIWI) questions the approach of business leaders to the looming water crisis in the summer edition of SIWI's in-house magazine *The New Economy*.

According to Berntell there is much talk of a low carbon economy but little mention of access to water, even though by 2025 three billion people might live in countries experiencing water stress. He feels that there's an urgent need to manage water resources more energy-efficiently, raise awareness of the impact of water use and prioritise investment to provide drinking water and sanitation.

WATER PRODUCTIVITY VIDEO

The first meeting of the Euro-Mediterranean Expert Group took place in Lisbon last month (June). Promoted by the MED SPRING (Mediterranean Science, Policy, Research and Innovation Gateway) project and financed by the 7th FP, it involved 50 experts from 28 partnership organisations based in the Mediterranean. Three main societal challenges were discussed: water resources, food quality and security, and energy.
